

In my current role I advise mainly in relation to insurance law and professional negligence. I advise insurance companies on policy wording, interpretation and complex coverage disputes, in particular relating to financial lines policies and directors' and officers' claims. I also manage a significant number of professional negligence cases, concerning accountants, solicitors, insurance brokers, stockbrokers and architects, for a variety of insurers, and I advise various parties on complaints brought before the Financial Services Ombudsman.

One of the best aspects of working in Dillon Eustace, which was evident from the outset of my traineeship, is the culture of collegiality. This atmosphere makes it more enjoyable to work together, giving you the feel that you are part of a team rather than competing against each other. There is also a great social side to the firm, with a wide range of events arranged throughout the year.

I am a solicitor in the Banking and Capital Markets team and I also assist the Insolvency and Restructuring team with large insolvency related assignments.

In my current role, I advise a wide variety of clients, including domestic and international financial institutions and corporate entities on all aspects of corporate banking and finance related transactions. I also advise both lenders and obligors on consensual work-outs, restructurings, debt buy-back arrangements, enforcement options and loan portfolio sales and acquisitions.

For me, there are two aspects to my role which are really interesting. Firstly, the transactional nature of the work, where your team works towards a completion date, overcoming “11th hour” issues to eventually closing the transaction and moving on to the next one. While this can require hard work, good communication skills and certainly a degree of endurance, it helps build a strong sense of collegiality within the team. Equally, it means collaborating with solicitors from other practice areas in the firm, as these types of corporate banking transactions rarely fall conveniently within one

practice area. It's this sense of collaboration and feeling part of a team that makes it more enjoyable to move on to the next transaction. Secondly, the complexity of the transactions and the scale of deals, ranging from simple financial deals to complex global transactions involving sophisticated financing arrangements is a big draw.

My main advice to someone interested in pursuing a career in law would be to do your research, speak to others and try to get a feel of what the role of a solicitor entails. Gain experience working in a law firm, particularly a corporate law firm if that is something that interests you.

Once your traineeship starts, make the most of your rotations, get stuck in and see what areas of law excite you. Always remain positive, get involved and enjoy your traineeship as time flies!
